




Demand ratio Dropout %



Report of the IQAC Activities taken in the YEAR 2012-13

5) Students were asked to participate in the Extension Activity of the University where by student took special lesson connected to the Indian culture and heritage. Each student gave one project on national integration per school which comprised of food, dance, culture and geographical uniqueness.

6) For bringing excellence to our program we also tried to have collaboration with the out side agencies to bring in the feature of National Integration. The Sarvodaya Mandal, The Anti dowry Cell, Mahim Nature Park, The Chatrapati Shaje Raje Musuem etc. there were special seesions held to promote national integration and understanding of how it needs to be developed.

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
