Further, "equal opportunity" and similar phrases such as "personal responsibility" have been used to diminish the prospective for realizing social justice by justifying enormous inequalities in modern society (Berry, 2005). The most recent theories of and scholarly statements about social justice illustrate the complex nature of the concept.

We are working toward a fairer society by improving equality and reducing discrimination and disadvantage for all, at work, in public and political life, and in people's life chances.




